Only The Empty Will Be Full

Luke 18:9-30

The sermon in one sentence:

- Those who fill themselves, God will truly empty;
- Those who empty themselves, God will truly fill.

Scene 1: The Pharisee and the Tax Collector at the temple (vv9-14; only in Luke)

Only the humble will be exalted.

- No one can earn Gold's approval, except Jesus.
- Jesus' sacrifice is the only way to God.

Scene 2: Jesus blesses the children (vv15-17; c.f. Matt 19:13-15; Mark 10:13-16)

Only the simple will be made wise

- Whoever does not receive the kingdom of God like a child shall not enter it.
- Little children just want to be with their fathers.

Scene 2: A rich, young ruler walks away from Jesus (vv18-25; c.f. Matt 19:16-24; Mark 10:17-25)

Only the poor will be made rich

- Earthly wealth is not helpful in attaining heavenly wealth; in fact, it's likely to be a hindrance.
